Carriers of Hope: This month the people of the CTEC churches (including us) collect goods to send to Carriers of Hope. It is a local registered charity that supports families experiencing real poverty and lacking the most basic personal and household facilities. Most such families are asylum seekers, refugees or Eastern European migrants fleeing persecution. Many of the families have an empty flat or house, but no money for household goods or furnishing. Food and clothing are often required. The urgent requirement is for non-perishable food, toiletries and cleaning products, any items for babies and children, adult clothes and household items (linen, towels, tea towels, table cloths, curtains, bedding and kitchen equipment – including kitchen tools, cutlery, pots and pans, brushes, mops, electric irons, ironing boards, clothes airers, etc). If you can donate any of these, please place them in the box at the back of the church. Large items can be left in the lobby. Thank you for your support.
