Remembrance 100: On Sunday, 4 August 1918, the fourth anniversary of the declaration of war, King George V and Queen Mary joined members of the House of Commons and the House of Lords for a special service at Saint Margaret's Church, Westminster. The King had asked that 4 August 1918 should be observed as a National Day of Prayer: 100 days later the war ended. On 4 August 2018 churches across the country from a spectrum of denominations started 100 days of prayer, peace and reconciliation. This is being called Remembrance 100.
