**Our Harvest Festival** is next Sunday (14<sup>th</sup> October). If you are wondering what to bring, contributions of tinned and non-perishable food items will be well received and passed to the Foodbank, and alternative items that you may wish to consider donating include: Tea Bags (40's or 80's, Co-op), Rice Pudding (ready-made, Ambrosia, individual servings), Soup (tinned), Peas or Baked Beans (small tins), Salmon (tinned), Jam or Marmalade (small jars, avoid jam with pips or coarse cut marmalade) & honey, Custard (ready-made, small cartons of Birds), Jelly (ready-made), Fruit preserved in juice (not syrup), or a Variety pack of breakfast cereal (8 small boxes in the pack),
